



# **Historical Data**


62.8% Increase 2008 – 2012






# **New School Inquiries**






# **Kansas Private Postsecondary Students 2007-2012**






# Students by Gender (as reported)






### **Age of Program Completers - 2011 - 2012**










### **Student Data Remarks**

- ★ 32 % Do Not Report any Ethnicity




# 17,819 Awards Completed 2012






# Largest Programs by Category 2012






# Largest Certificate Programs 2012





### **Degree Programs by Category**






# **Program Data Remarks**

- ★ 89% of Awards are at Certificate Level
- ★ 11% of Awards are at Degree Level
- ★ Largest Number of Certificate Programs are in Real Estate, Health Care, Trade & Industry and IT
- ★ Largest Number of Degree Programs are in Education, Health Care, Business and Criminal Justice

# Regulation of Private Postsecondary and Out-of-State Institutions

- Regulations began in 1909
- ★ 1999 authority transferred from KSDE to KBOR
- 2004 the Kansas Private and Out-of-State
   Postsecondary Educational Institution Act first enacted; K.S.A. 74-32,162 et seq.



### **Definition: Postsecondary Institution**

Any business, operated for profit or not-for-profit:

- Which either (a) has a physical presence in Kansas or (b) solicits students within Kansas to attend school while remaining in Kansas
- That is (a) offering degrees or (b) training or preparing people for a field of endeavor in a business, trade, technical or industrial occupation
- That is not exempted by the Act.



# **Certificate of Approval**

- ★ Required for lawful operation
- ★ Issued by the Board if statutory standards are met
- ★ 30 days to 9 months to review for approval
- ★ Renewed annually
- ★ Must continually comply



# **Applications & Renewals**

Financially responsible Fulfill commitments for instruction No erroneous or misleading advertising Meet requirements for Courses, curriculum and instruction material, space, etc. Provide qualified directors, administrators and instructors Provide student information about tuition, fees, and refunds Comply with Rules pertaining to absence, attendance, and academic records Rules of operation and student conduct furnished to students Students are given certificates, diplomas or degrees upon completion Comply with all local, state and federal regulations



# **Program Reviews & Site Reviews**

### **Program Reviews Reference:**

- ★ State licensing boards (e.g. nursing)
- ★ National and/or industry standards
- ★ Experts in the field
- ★ National and/or Regional Accreditation

### **Up-to-Date Site Reviews:**

- ★ On a five year cycle
- ★ May be visited more often, as needed
- ★ Defer to experts in the field



# Complaints

Complaint process posted at schools and KBOR website. They are decreasing:

$$2008 - 41$$
,  $2009 - 36$ ,  $2010 - 15$ ,  $2011 - 11$ ,  $2012 - 4$ 

- ★ Site reviews increased, provide more training to schools
- ★ Investigations includes contacting school for a info & response
- ★ Work with Attorney General and local District Attorneys



# **Final Remarks**

- ★ New tax incentives seem to be bringing new brick & mortar institutions.
- ★ Overall enrollments will likely continue to decline due to an improving economy and the quality standards set by Kansas Private and Out of State Postsecondary Act.
