Students Right To Know Act

- The federal Student Right-to-Know Act is a law passed by Congress in 1990 that requires institutions eligible for Title IV funding under the Higher Education Act of 1965 to disclose the completion or graduation rate of certificate- or degree-seeking, full-time students entering those institutions. The law requires colleges and universities that administer federal Title IV funds to disclose certain information to prospective and enrolled students, parents and employees. The law requires institutions to collect, report, and disclose graduation rates for full-time, first-time, degree-seeking undergraduate students. - Kansas state law - Students Right to Know Act, K.S.A. 72-297:
Requires the state department of education to ensure the distribution to each student or each student's parents the degree prospectus information published by the state board of regents in accordance with K.S.A. 74-32,303, and amendments thereto, the Kansas training information program report published in accordance with K.S.A. 74-32,418, and amendments thereto, any other information relevant to students' understanding of potential earnings as determined by the department of labor and the potential earnings published by each branch of the armed services of the United States military.

Primary Population of Students

(Technical colleges do not have residency requirements outlined in statute.)

Total Annual Cost (estimated): Sum of the Individual Values Tuition, Fees, Books and Supplies, Room and Board.

Estimated Cost: The estimated cost of the degree over time, based on the Total Annual Cost * the Number of Years displayed, which has been adjusted for inflation using a rate of CPI + 2%, currently $4.7\% + 0.02 = 6.7\%$.

Number of Years: The Number of Years for two-year preparatory programs has been defaulted to "two." For four-year degree programs, the number of years is calculated as the median of the credit hours associated with the final degree plus any transfer credit hours divided by 30 as reported in the KHEDS Completions and Transfers files of degree program or related degree program graduates $[(CM.FINAL_GPA_CREDIT_HRS - CM.TRANS_UG_CREDIT_HRS_GPA + TR.TRANS_UG_CREDIT_HRS) / 30]$.

Kansas Promise Act Scholarship

- Eligible institutions must have at least one existing eligible program and include:
 - Public community colleges;
 - Public technical colleges;
 - Washburn Institute of Technology; and
 - Private, not-for-profit institutions that offer eligible programs
- Eligible programs must fall under one of the following fields:
 - Information technology and security;
 - Mental and physical healthcare;
 - Advanced manufacturing and building trades;
 - Early childhood education and development; OR
 - Specific regionally-important fields of:
 - agriculture,
 - food and natural resources,
 - education and training,
 - law, public safety, corrections, and security,
 - transportation, distribution and logistics



Kansas Promise Act Scholarship

Highlights:

- Must complete FAFSA
- Family income requirements
- Students must maintain satisfactory academic and successfully complete the program within 36 months
- After completion, student must reside in and commence work in Kansas and for at least two consecutive years following completion of the promise-eligible program OR enroll as a full-time student or a part-time student in any public or private postsecondary educational institution with its primary location in Kansas

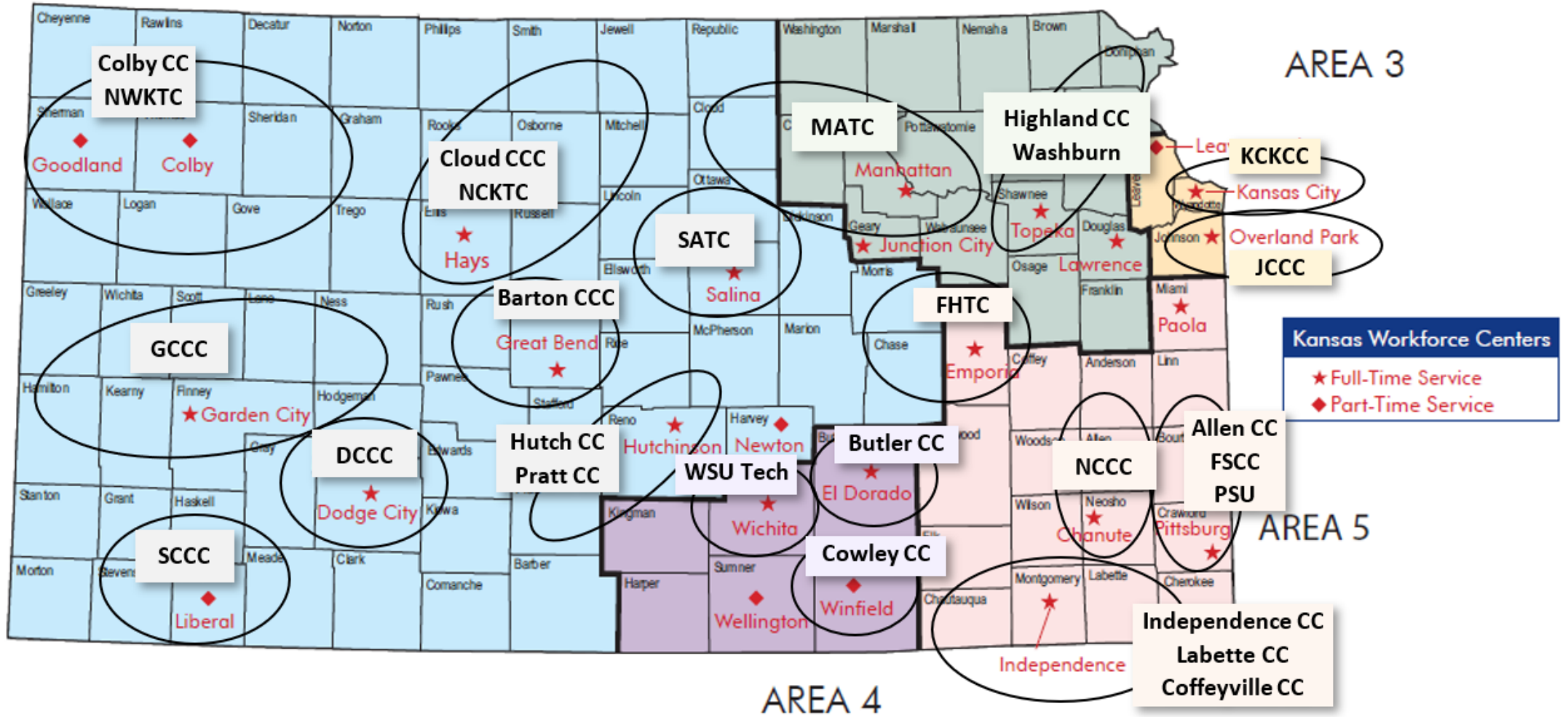
- Perkins V “Strengthening Career and Technical Education for the 21st Century Act” was signed into law on July 31, 2018
 - Kansas receives approximately \$12 million
 - benefits secondary & postsecondary CTE
- CLNA = Data-driven decision making to improve quality and access
 - Identifies strengths and gaps in CTE programs
 - Drives application development and spending
 - Is repeated every two years
 - Engages regional team partners
