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OER Student Survey in Kansas

Sustainability has long been a major concern for development and use of open educational materials. Obtaining funding for the creation and adaption of OER in a manner that does not burden students often requires data to demonstrate how OER support student success and access.

The Open Up Learning Kansas steering committee is currently planning data collection regarding student views on open educational resources from Kansas Institutions of higher education by distributing student surveys, both to KBOR institutions and private institutions in the state. Melissa Emo, Digital Scholarship and OER Librarian and Emporia University, says the primary goal of the survey is "to understand students' experiences with open educational resources (OER) and their perceptions of these materials." The Open Up Learning Kansas steering committee intends to use this data as evidence to the impact of OER as we continue to advocate for state support. The data may also be used at each institution to help further institutional OER initiatives.

KU Libraries Open Education Week

For Open Education Week, University of Kansas Libraries is welcoming Dr. Virginia Clinton-Lisell, Associate Professor in Educational Foundations and Research at University of North Dakota and lead researcher of the Open Education Group, to KU's Lawrence campus on March 14th at 10 a.m. in Watson Library 3 West. She will deliver a public presentation entitled, "The Power of Open Education: Research-Based Insights on Open Licensing in the Classroom," which will focus on the research evidence for open education's benefits for students. This includes adopting open educational resources, which are teaching and learning resources with open licensing that allows them to be accessed without financial barriers, as well as open pedagogy in which students are mentored in co-creating and developing their course assignments to add value to the world beyond. Current trends in educational materials for college students such as online commercial homework systems that require purchasing access codes and automatic textbook billing (inclusive access) will also be discussed in terms of research evidence.

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
