Call for OER Discipline Liaisons

The OER community supports one another through sharing of experience and resources. One way that Open Up Learning Kansas does this is through displine liaisons. The committee maintains a list of Kansas professionals in a variety of academic disciplines who have agreed to make themselves available to assist colleagues with questions about OER in their subject area.

The discipline liaison list is located on the KBOR website at https://www.kansasregents.gov/academic_affairs/open-educational-resources/kbor-discipline-liaison. It includes 23 liaisons for 21 different subject areas, including biology, communication, chemistry, economics, educational leadership, educational technology, English, French, geography, graphic communications, health & nutrition, history, languages, library science, management, mathematics, microbiology, sociology, theatre, and teacher education. But there are still many disciplines for which we lack liaisons.
