OVERVIEW

The Kansas Board of Regents' Transfer and Articulation Council (TAAC) created a "Communication Plan" to coordinate the marketing of **Systemwide Transfer** (SWT) among the 32 public postsecondary institutions across Kansas.

This document contains agreed-upon language to be used online and in digital and print communication resources, as well as a shared visual identity to support the clear and consistent messaging for SWT courses. Additionally, to support clarity of approved SWT courses, a "micro-logo" may be added to both digital and print course catalogs across the system, as institutions are able.

TRANSFER KANSAS PORTAL

KBOR has created a new transfer portal as of 2020. The Transfer Kansas portal houses all Systemwide Transfer (SWT) courses approved by the Kansas Board of Regents, for which faculty develop and update learning outcomes.
